# **August 2011 (Produced in June)**

<u>Goodnight-Loving</u>—The first in a two-part photographic journey that covers the cattle-driving partnership that began with a handshake over a campfire in 1866. Sites may include Oran, Fort Belknap, Buffalo Gap, Fort Concho, Horsehead Crossing, Llano Estacado landscapes, and Weatherford.

<u>Dallas Arboretum</u>—Sixty six acres on White Rock Lake offer a complement of dedicated gardens, educational programs for children and adults, and an array of annual events. <u>Brady Goat Cook-Off</u>—A cook-off judge provides a behind-the-scenes look at this decades-old event.

<u>San Antonio Missions</u>—An engaging photographic tour of the four 18<sup>th</sup>-Century missions that form San Antonio Missions National Historical Park.

### September 2011 (Produced in July)

### TRUE, TEXAS SPECIAL

<u>True</u>, <u>Texas</u>—2011 "True" designations to be decided.

Goodnight-Loving—Part two of the photo series. Goodnight's legacy.

<u>Fests-Up/Events</u>— Our annual roundup of fall festivals; lineup tentatively includes Caldwell's Kolache Festival, Menard's Jim Bowie Days, Boerne's Harvest Moon Festival, and the Iron Horse Fall Fest in Mineola.

#### October 2011 (Produced in August)

<u>Bastrop/Buescher State Parks</u>—A weekend camping trip in the Lost Pines of Bastrop and Buescher state parks.

<u>Quinta Mazatlan</u>—One of nine World Birding Center sites, this Spanish Revival-style mansion in downtown McAllen sits on a 20-acre Tamaulipan thornforest sanctuary. <u>East Texas Wine Trail</u>— A Piney Woods winery ramble, to include Los Pinos Ranch Vineyards and Kiepersol Estates.

<u>Colors of Fall</u>—In addition to the fiery hues of leaves in late fall, Steve Schwartzman's photos showcase the yellow, tan, white, and purple of autumn wildflowers and grasses.

#### **November 2011 (Produced in September)**

<u>Four for Fall</u>—Our annual fall-foliage viewing roundup; will tentatively include the Copper Breaks area, Canadian, and Daingerfield State Park. Fourth location to be announced.

<u>Caddo Country</u>— An exploration of the 1,000-year legacy of the Caddo Indians, who established agricultural settlements in East Texas. Sites will include Caddo Mounds State

Historic Site near Alto, Caddo Lake, and a museum (to be decided) with a comprehensive Caddo collection.

<u>Irving</u>—Editor Charles Lohrmann's take on this Metroplex gem, whose central location entices travelers who can "find it here, or near."

<u>Spirit of the Bay</u>—E. Dan Klepper explores Espiritu Santo Bay and the surrounding area, including Port O'Connor and Matagorda Island.

## **December 2011 (Produced in October)**

<u>Grapevine</u>—Celebrate the season in the "Christmas Capital of Texas." Some 1,400 events take place in 40+ days.

<u>Lubbock Lights</u>—Holiday festivities from the Ranching Heritage Center to Ransom Canyon.

<u>Houston's Hidden Museums</u>—Houston boasts a slew of world-class museums, along with some quiet jewels, including the Air Terminal Museum, American Cowboy Museum, Museum of Printing History, Maritime Museum, and Fire Museum.

<u>San Antonio Rocks</u>—Quarries throughout the Alamo City have been transformed into vibrant destinations, including the San Antonio Zoo, Alamo Quarry Marketplace, Six Flags Fiesta Texas, The Rim, and Trinity University.

#### **January 2012 (Produced in November)**

<u>Texas Two-Step</u>—We'll cover the origins and evolution of the dance step, where to take lessons, and a few great places around the state to go boot-scooting, from Gruene Hall to Austin's Broken Spoke to Billy Bob's in Fort Worth.

<u>Quirky Quarters</u>—Unusual lodgings, from a Safari Tent at Fossil Rim Wildlife Center to the Teepee Motel in Wharton.

<u>Panhandle Winter</u>—A collection of Wyman Meinzer's snowy photos from the top of Texas.

### February 2012 (Produced in December)

<u>Edom</u>—Known for its fine crafts and comfort food at the Shed and the Edom Bakery & Grill, this East Texas arts community also offers outdoor diversions at pick-your-own Blueberry Hills Farms and Blue Moon Gardens.

<u>Presidio</u>—A checklist of must-do's in this history-rich border city.

<u>Independence Creek Preserve</u>—E. Dan Klepper explores this pristine desert oasis in Terrell County, protected by the Texas Nature Conservancy.

### March 2012 (Produced in January)

<u>Caprock Canyons Trailway</u>—Although the tracks are long gone, the railroad berm has been transformed into a 64-mile hike, equestrian, and bike trail that traverses the pastoral farms of the Red River Valley before entering canyon country.

<u>Upper Brazos River Trip</u>—A canoe excursion along the John Graves Scenic Waterway, starting just below Possum Kingdom dam.

April 2012 (Produced in February)

<u>Wildflower Drives</u>—Nature-willing, the Chalk Mountain, Brownwood, and Del Rio areas will be included.

<u>Train Rides</u>—Our intrepid editor embarks on the *Heartland Flyer* and other Lone Star rail excursions.

<u>Buffalo Gap Food and Wine Summit</u>— A weekend of fine wine and food at Perini Ranch.

# May 2012 (Produced in March)

### SUMMER PLANNER

<u>Hill Country River Region</u>—Will van Overbeek captures Leakey, Utopia, and Garner State Park in late-spring splendor.

<u>Farmcations</u>—The agri-tourism movement is growing, with many farms and ranches offering extended-stay peaks into the realities of rural life. To include The Greer Farm (Daingerfield); Sand Creek Farm (Cameron); Yonder Way Farm (Brenham); and Agarita Creek Farms (Fredericksburg).
